**Call to Order**

President Wendy Dunn called the meeting of the Campolindo Parents Club (CPC) Board to order at 9:06am

**Approval of Minutes**

**Approve Parents Club 2012-2013 Calendar - Wendy Dunn**

Will approve via email. We do not have Booster spring date yet.

**MEF Update - Kim Matranga**

Donations are up over 20% in the bank. Total pledges and donations up 50% over last year. Photo-a-thon will only be held on Tuesday and Wednesday.

We had a meeting to start planning a more targeted Campo campaign starting in January/February 2013.

In December, we will write letters to welcome/target incoming 9<sup>th</sup> grade families.

**Legislative Update - Nancy Kendzierski**

Discussed best way to get message to students who can vote - need to make sure they actually vote since there is likelihood that they will vote "yes" on Proposition 30 and 38 since they are tied to the schools.

The general message is to vote yes on both Prop 30 and 38.

Major Difference between the two:

Prop 30: More of a direct effect on higher education

Prop 38: Nothing for higher education

If neither passes, higher education will lose \$1 billion in funding. Up until a few weeks ago Prop 30 polling over 50% until the attack ads began.

Wendy – would like Nancy to pull together communication to parents regarding voting – especially on voting day.

Also come up with something for absentee ballots.

Counseling office hands out voter registration paperwork to all 18 year olds.

\$2.3 loss for AUHSD if neither passes.

Discussed having some volunteers the morning of voting day with balloons to greet parents/students in their cars and encourage them to vote.

On a sidenote, emails can be added to the directory. One email per family, one phone number. Nancy K will work on this for next year.

### **Webmaster Update – Susan Furay**

PC donations have been added back to the Webstore through the rest of the year. New form for parents to print out and send in a check District is looking at separating out the donations through RevTrak instead of all running through ASB.

Four classified ads – we should highlight them in bulletin.

Also highlight PC funding of clubs. Revised calendar is on website.

### **Escrip Update – Wendy Dunn**

### **President's Update – Wendy Dunn**

1) Insider's Guide to Campo very successful -interesting presentations from teachers and staff. The informal flow worked well – parents ate first, then listened.

Close to 100 parents. Let's look at not closing the library next year for this event

2) Grad Night Insurance – they are working on it. Will consult with Josie. Josie will double check with Charlotte Holden on all insurance issues.

Grad night is a surprise for students – will roll out in February.

3) Teacher Appreciation coming up. Please sign up to bring food.

4) Email to executive board to approve \$2000 for Competitive Speech and Debate Club. Tina Mayer is the advisor. Money is for materials,

entrance fees, etc. This is seed money. They will be joining the Golden Gate Speech Association.

5) Class Advisors looking for breakdown of job, many questions regarding the funds and ensuring there is enough for the Senior Ball.

### **Principal's Report - John Walker**

1) Diana Obrand and Marcia Holbrook were honored with the Sue Stouffer Award at the last Coordinating Council meeting

2) API Campolindo 922 score based on STAR testing and exit exam scores. This score places us in the top 20 high schools in the state (does not include charter or specialty schools).

One point down from last year.

Acalanes Union High School District first time in history over 900 AP Index at 75% - this many students have taken and passed at least one AP class.

3) Club Day - 45 extra-curricular clubs, Competitive Speech and Debate newest

4) Schoolloop - First quarter over this Friday. Students and parents should see an updated progress report complete with assignment scores by midnight October 30<sup>th</sup>.

Still have 250-260 parents still not registered out of 1094 families.

Working on this through communication and phone calls. John Barracus new Intervention Specialist (formerly Crisis Counselor). Is here 10am-3pm every day except Wednesday.

5) Collaboration continuing to be focus - all teachers on a collaboration team. Twice a year they going to build a project, an activity, and/or assessment and build it and then examine results. This will help start conversations on workload. Debrief will help with rigor as well as consistency of grading. Every teacher is on a team

6) Student Life - Homecoming this week.

7) Monday 29<sup>th</sup> is 8<sup>th</sup> grade parent student night for parents considering this school. Postcards have been mailed to two feeder schools (JM and Stanley).

8) Would like to have more parents come in, have a few department chairs and have a Q & A. Add on two more Insider's Guides to Campo types events. Other sites have more than we do. Maybe have one focusing on Naviance?

### **Treasurer's Report - Josie Arth**

Info through Sept - ahead of budget \$169k now \$181k for CPC

Looking good with inflows.

Has become apparent - we have a lot of cash. We need to separate out and place in two different accounts (Wells Fargo Money Market account). Josie will take care of this.

Haven't pulled out eScrip in the past but have now - little under \$115k eScrip restricted (page 2, bottom right)

Review statements done- taxes ready to be filed - will put on website.
